1. Increase operating funding for all universities based on the number of students and services provided.

- Current state funding is below 2002 levels.

2. Release appropriated capital dollars for new projects and deferred maintenance

- By investing in capital and deferred maintenance programs, the state can preserve the integrity of university infrastructure and free up operating funds that would otherwise be spent on emergency repairs.
- These funds are critical for upgrading aging facilities, enhancing energy efficiency, and improving campus safety and accessibility.
- Investment in state-of-the-art facilities and technology is essential
 to attract top students and faculty, maintaining our institution's
 competitive position in higher education.
